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## **New Single-Family Residence Permit Checklist**

Listed below are the submittal requirements for a **New Single-Family Residence**:

- Broward County Uniform Permit Application per discipline (Structural, Roof, Plumbing, Electrical, Mechanical, Irrigation, Driveway, Pool, Fence, Dock, Seawall, etc.)
- Signed Contract including cost breakdown
- o Recorded Notice of Commencement (If job value exceeds \$2500)
- Contractor records are current
- Two (2) sets of current property surveys
- Two (2) complete sets of plans (Signed & Sealed if over \$10,000) indicating the following information:
  - Occupancy Group
  - Type of Construction
  - Square Footage (A/C & Non-A/C)
  - Method of Compliance
  - Interior Finishes
  - Roof framing plan- include the required bracing
  - Flood Zone- BFE &DFE
  - Materials to be used- wood, concrete, plastic class
  - Foundation, Column, Beam Schedules
  - Window & Door Schedule- include design wind loads
- o Two (2) Soil Conditions (Geotech Report) or a Soil Statement
- o Two (2) Energy Calculations Forms, Heating/Cooling Load Calcs, Manufacturer Specs
- o Two (2) Structural calculations- signed & sealed
- Two (2) Window & Door Product Approvals
- Two (2) Copies of Shop Drawings (Signed & Sealed and Approved by Designer of Record)
  - Required for stairs, Railings, Screen Enclosures or any other applicable special construction
- Two (2) sets of Truss Drawings (submitted prior to receiving Foundation Inspection)
- Approval from Broward County Environmental Protection & Growth Management Department
- o Two (2) Refer to FBC 107.3 for minimum plan review criteria
- Two (2) Special Inspector Forms (if project involves reinforced masonry construction or pilings)
- Tree Removal Permit will be required if trees are located within the slab area (obtain at Broward County)
- Copy of Receipt from Broward County for School Road Impact Fees
